RealLegal Unveils Milestone in Digital Signature Technology during Court Reporting Conference

Trend underscores preference for transcript-specific format

LAS VEGAS, October 10, 2008 – RealLegal, a leader in litigation and court reporting technology, has announced that 400,000 E-Transcript files have now been digitally signed and sealed using RealLegal E-Transcript Signatures™. This milestone marks a growth rate of more than 1,000 percent during the past two years. The public announcement was made today during the California Court Reporting Association (CCRA) 98th Annual Conference in Las Vegas.

This significant growth in the use of E-Transcript Signatures is mainly attributed to the momentum in the industry for responsible distribution of electronic files.

According to Jason Primuth, general manager for the RealLegal product line and featured presenter at the CCRA event, additional reasons for the growth include affordability, reliability and compatibility of the technology.

Said Primuth: “The E-Transcript format is widely used because it provides a convenient and inexpensive method for court reporters to certify and seal their work product. The Am Law Tech Survey, which is published by Incisive Media (formerly American Lawyer Media), has ranked LiveNote as the #1 most widely used litigation support software of any kind for four consecutive years.

For authorized recipients who do not use a specific transcript software, they may view the signed and secured content in the E-Transcript Viewer, a free viewing application that has been downloaded nearly 0.5 million times.
